

Mission: To serve as the state's gateway for the delivery of criminal justice information by providing **accurate, timely and **complete** information for better decision-making.**




WHY DO WE NEED TO SHARE INFO?




HOW IT WORKS



Nlets receives MN query, checks the validity, then forwards it to Texas

A MN State Trooper pulls over a driver with a Minnesota license.
MN does not have internal data on TX driver.
A query is sent to Nlets.



Nlets sends query, gathers the response back to Nlets

1.5 seconds!!



Nlets receives the response from TX and forwards to MN



BCA APPLICATIONS

- Permit Tracking System
 - Designed for 87 MN Sheriff's departments to maintain data on permit to carry applicants in their jurisdiction
 - Allows for efficient transfer of data of applicants for background checks
- Gun Permit Background Check
 - Used for permit to carry and permit to purchase/transfer applicants
 - Queries 10 different systems from one search
 - NICS, NCIC, III, NLETS
 - MN Hotfiles, Criminal History, DVS, MNCIS Criminal, MNCIS Civil, DHS



BCA APPLICATIONS

- DVS Access
 - Allows law enforcement to access DVS information
 - Drivers license
 - License plate
 - Dealers
- License Plate Reader
 - Data file comprised of multiple systems
 - FBI Hot files – stolen vehicles, wanted persons
 - MN Hot files – wanted persons, KOPS alerts
 - DVS – suspended/revoked licenses

POR SYSTEMS (PREDATORY OFFENDER REGISTRY)

- POR RMS (Records Management System)
- POR LE (Law Enforcement site)
- POR ES (Electronic Submissions site)
- POR Public Non-Compliant Website
 - NSOPW (National Sex Offender Public Website) – links to this BCA site and MN DOC's (Department of Corrections) Public Registrant site (level 3 and provisionally discharged civil commitments (Sexually Dangerous/Sexually Psychopathic Personality)



POR RMS (RECORDS MANAGEMENT SYSTEM)

- Internal POR Unit system
 - Create offender files
 - Update offender information
 - Transmit offender information to FBI record (when eligible)
 - Transmit offender information to MN record (all offenders)
 - Contains documents and photos



POR LE (LAW ENFORCEMENT)

- Built in 2008
 - First used by law enforcement to query POR data
 - Generate list of offenders in jurisdiction (area searches)
 - Generate list of potential suspects (investigative search)
 - Later allowed view into offender file – added corrections/probation users

POR ES (ELECTRONIC SUBMISSIONS)

- Allows full view of offender file, documents and photos
- Allows for forms to be completed online with law enforcement/corrections/probation:
 - Change of Information
 - Homeless Check Ins
 - Incarceration Reports
 - Upload documents
 - Upload photos
 - Registrations (soon)
 - Change of Status (tbd)

POR NON-COMPLIANT PUBLIC WEBSITE

- Per statute website is available, the amount and type of information made available is limited to the information necessary for the public to assist law enforcement in locating the offender.
- Posting criteria:
 - Not in a residential facility or incarcerated
 - Non-compliant for over 30 days
 - 16 years or older

Welcome to the Predatory Offender Registration (POR) public Web site of the Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (BCA). The purpose of this site is to enhance public safety by identifying offenders who are non-compliant with registration requirements, and to obtain assistance from the public in locating them.

You will have the opportunity to search for non-compliant predatory offenders by first name, last name, age and location. **This Web site does not contain information about compliant registrants.**

Minnesota's Predatory Offender Registry was established on August 1, 1991. Since then, the BCA's POR unit has maintained the state's central database of information on predatory offenders. Visit the BCA's website for the [current list of offenses requiring registration](#).

Those who are required to register must provide information about their primary and secondary addresses, employment, and vehicles they own or operate. They are also required to return periodic verification forms to ensure all information on file with the BCA remains up to date. When predatory offenders fail to report changes in the required information or if they fail to return verification forms they are classified as "non-compliant."

Most registration information is classified as private, however, pursuant to M.S. § 243.106, Subd. 7a., the BCA is authorized to make registration information available to the public when a registrant who is over the age of 16 has failed to provide information regarding his/her primary or secondary address and has been non-compliant for thirty days or longer. The BCA is limited by statute to release only enough information about non-compliant registrants to allow the public to assist in locating them.

The public is strongly encouraged to notify the Minnesota Predatory Offender Unit or a local law enforcement agency of any information concerning the whereabouts of "non-compliant" registrants.



FINGERPRINTING & CRIMINAL HISTORY

WHERE DOES THE INFORMATION GO?



LIVESCAN

Livescan devices:

- Capture biometric fingerprint data
- 99% of criminal fingerprints are submitted electronically to the BCA
 - Ink cards are mailed to BCA, scanned, and entered so the submission follows the same process as Livescan submissions
- Used for civil prints for employment and licensing



BCA FINGERPRINT SYSTEM - ABIS

AUTOMATED BIOMETRIC IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM

- Implemented in May 2023 replacing AFIS
- One of the first major BCA systems to be moved to the cloud.
- Remote Latent Print Labs - 5 labs
- Attempt to match to other fingerprints in MN to establish identity.
- Checks against latent prints of unsolved crimes
- Sends to FBI to compare against national fingerprints
- Other services provided:
 - Rapid identification
 - Civil background checks



RAPID ID

- Available to Law Enforcement Agencies
- Assist at a traffic stop in the field to identify person based on biometric fingerprint data
- Returns MN and FBI data includes a photo if photo available in the Criminal History System (CHS)
- DEMO unit available today



MINNESOTA REPOSITORY OF ARREST PHOTOS (MRAP)

- Database of arrest & booking photos and other identifying information submitted by law enforcement agencies
- MN law enforcement agencies utilize MRAP to:
 - Verify the ID of a subject
 - Create photo line up
 - Import non-arrest photos
 - Search based on known demographics and crime type

- There is a banner on criminal history records noting certain low-level marijuana-related offenses are no longer a crime and are eligible for sealing.
- BCA is working toward Clean Slate Expungements to be implemented by January 2025.




WHAT IS ECHARGING

- eCharging
 - Statewide standardized electronic workflow and document(s) creation system that moves criminal justice information between MN criminal justice agencies
 - Helps to facilitate the creation, validation of information and workflow of many different criminal justice processes
 - Integrations with:
 - Driver and Vehicle Services
 - Minnesota Court System
 - Law Enforcement and Prosecutors in each county
 - BCA Toxicology Lab

ECHARGING BENEFITS

- Reduces redundant data entry between agencies
- Improves processing time by eliminating the need for documents as they flow between agencies
- Eliminates travel time for users
 - (search warrants, citations, complaints, petition, DWI's)
- eCharging standardized workflow and documents throughout all 87 counties for many different processes



ECHARGING SUCCESS

- Saves at least 45 minutes per criminal complaint resulting in 75,000 fewer total staff hours per year and 45 minutes per DWI arrest resulting in 20,000+ fewer total staff hours/year.
- Carver County Implements eCharging
 - \$86,000 saved in one year
 - \$517,000 + saved over 5 years



NO-KNOCK REPORTING

- All agencies are required to submit a report to MN BCA when a no-knock report is requested
 - MN Statute 626.14, subd. 4; went into effect Sept. 1, 2021
- The Bureau must also produce an annual summary report to the Commissioner



NO-KNOCK REPORTING (CONTINUED)



- What no-knock information is reported?
 - Number of warrants requested
 - Number of warrants court issued
 - Number of warrants executed
 - Number of injuries and fatalities suffered, if any, by peace officers and civilians during warrant execution
- **Reports to MN BCA are due no later than 90 days after the warrant was issued.** Warrant reports are submitted via MN BCA's Supplemental Reporting System.





NO-KNOCK REPORTING (CONTINUED)

- “Is a report required even if the warrant is denied or never executed?”
 - Yes!
- “What if we didn’t actually enter a structure?”
 - Still required, e.g.:
 - Ion swabs
 - Canine sniffs
 - Vehicle trackers
 - UAV / aerial surveillance



NO-KNOCK REPORTING (CONTINUED)

CRIME REPORTING

- Crime reporting lands within one of two areas:
 - Supplemental reporting
 - NIBRS reporting



CRIME REPORTING – SUPPLEMENTAL

- Supplemental reporting covers the following areas:
 - Firearms discharge (MN Statute 626.553)
 - Includes accidental discharges and private security
 - Use of force (MN Statute 626.5534)
 - Death, serious bodily injury, and firearms discharge
 - Pursuits (MN Statute 626.5532)
 - Active pursuits only



CRIME REPORTING – NIBRS



- NIBRS:
 - National Incident-Based Reporting System
 - Program developed and administered by FBI
 - MN NIBRS data is 'rolled up' to the FBI for use and consideration at a national level
 - Meets the FBI's UCR goal of providing a common language for different criminal statutes, which produces a nationwide view of crime statistics




The BCA compiles a statistical report each year detailing the amount of criminal activity in the state. The data for this report is submitted by individual law enforcement agencies. The report includes offenses, clearances and arrests, as well as the number of law enforcement officers killed or assaulted, firearms discharges by law enforcement, missing children reports, police pursuits and bias offenses. Limited information is also available on law enforcement personnel.

 - New data monthly, updated data daily
 - Meets the requirement of the Uniform Crime Report in near real-time
 - Download the data you’re interested in and create your own visuals!




NEW: CARJACKING DATA ADDED TO MN CDE

- Designated reporting area in the MN Crime Data Explorer (introduced December 2023)
- Includes:
 - Number of attempted and completed offenses
 - Injury type
 - Weapon or force involved
 - Victim and offender demographics
 - Monthly trends
 - Offenses by day and hour

 - Drug arrest information (NIBRS)

CURRENT VACANCIES

Three (3) members of the Judicial Branch appointed by the chief justice of the Supreme Court – **2 vacancies**

The Commissioner of Administration or designee

The State Court Administrator or designee

Two (2) members appointed by the Minnesota Sheriffs Association, at least one of whom must be a sheriff

Two (2) members appointed by the Minnesota League of Cities representing the interests of city attorneys, at least one of whom must be a city attorney

Two (2) probation officers appointed by the Commissioner of Corrections in consultation with the president of the Minnesota Association of County Probation Officers (MACPO) – **1 vacancy**

Four (4) public members appointed by the Governor for a term of six (6) years, one of whom represents the interests of victims, and one whom represents the private business community who have expertise in integrated information systems – **2 vacancies**

Two (2) members appointed by the Minnesota Association of Counties, one of whom works or resides in Greater Minnesota and one of whom works or resides in the seven-county metropolitan area; and one of whom is an elected official – **1 vacancy**

One (1) member of the Senate appointed by the majority leader of the Senate

One (1) member appointed by the attorney general
