

**Owner's Certification of Exemption
For
Installation of Carbon Monoxide Alarms**

MN Statute 299F.51 – Exception:

Subdivision 5 (b) An owner of a multifamily dwelling that contains minimal or no sources of carbon monoxide may be exempted from the requirements of subdivision 1, provided that such owner certifies to the commissioner of public safety that such multifamily dwelling poses no foreseeable carbon monoxide risk to the health and safety to the dwelling units.

1. Read Minnesota Statute 299F.51 and,
2. The facility contains minimal or no sources of carbon monoxide such that the multi-family dwelling contains no foreseeable carbon monoxide risks. In other words, the building is all electric with no fuel-fired appliances.

*Please consider that the following are common sources of carbon monoxide that can be hazardous to human occupants.

Gas kitchen range
Gas, oil, wood, coal, kerosene, corn furnaces, heaters, boilers, stoves
Gas, charcoal grills allowed within building
Gas, oil water heaters
Gas clothes dryers
Gas ovens
Gas fryers or other gas kitchen appliances
Portable fuel or gas heaters
Gas, oil, wood fireplaces
Other fuel burning appliances
